#### Welcome to the Focus Centre!

One of our volunteers tells us what it's like working in the Welcome Lounge:

I'm Sinead and I work in the Welcome Lounge alongside a team of incredible volunteers, with backgrounds ranging from teaching and SEND support to helping people with alcohol recovery. They're a lovely bunch of people.

Over the past year, I've spent a lot of time learning about different support that is out there for people. I've also had the pleasure of meeting so many inspiring people who dedicate their time to helping others.

Now that the Welcome Lounge is open it's wonderful to put that learning into practice. People can drop in for a chat – about anything really. Sometimes just talking to someone outside of your usual circle can make a big difference.

People come in for all sorts of reasons. I never know who is going to walk through the door, but that's part of what makes this role so special. I get the chance to really listen and, hopefully, help people find what they need.





Oscar-winning actor Mark Rylance and campaigning writer George Monbiot are coming together to host a public forum about how local communities like Purbeck can influence national and global progress.

Planet Purbeck

Topics up for open discussion at the event – staged by community group Planet Purbeck at Sandy Hill Arts in Corfe Castle – will include

thorny issues such as rewilding, tourist taxes and, in a wider context, efforts to solve the convergent economic and ecological crises.

Rylance, who won the Best Supporting Actor Oscar for his performance in the Steven Spielberg film Bridge of Spies, and Monbiot, a leading critic of mainstream politics and passionate environmentalist, will conduct a Q&A session with each other and take questions from the audience. The actor, who is Patron of Planet Purbeck, will also auction a signed photographic portrait of himself as Henry VIII's scheming chief minister Thomas Cromwell – a prop used in the acclaimed BBC series Wolf Hall. And he will help to launch a Friends of Planet Purbeck scheme aimed at expanding the group. He said:

"I hope the chat with George will be full of ideas I haven't imagined and good humour. I will depend on the audience for the really smart questions.

"There is a desire to build up a group of people interested in similar things such as nature conservation and climate change so there is a place they can come with concerns – and make a difference with ideas and action.

"I believe in thinking internationally but acting locally. If you change a small or local thing well enough it will affect the rest, which is true in biology and the environments we live in. We can lift the whole system into a better place of harmony and equilibrium."

Guardian columnist and author Monbiot said of the event: "I'm greatly looking forward to it. We'll be navigating the great political and ecological crises in which we find ourselves, and hoping to chart a path through."

The forum, on October 11, is the third in a series of Planet Purbeck Presents events scheduled for the autumn.

It follows a "marine ecology evening" co-hosted by Greenpeace in Swanage on September 19 and a theatrical and musical performance of Stravinsky's short masterpiece The Soldier's Tale in Langton Matravers on September 26.

Kyle's knowledge and experience have been invaluable to us so hopefully we can maintain strong links 'on line'. We are also saddened to hear of the death of Paddy Rideal one of our past Defib guardians who, like her many guardian colleagues, provided regular and committed maintenance to her local defibrillator ensuring the kit was 'rescue ready'. 
We are not holding an annual meeting this year but would like to say a big 'thank you ' to all those who support Swanage Community Defibrillator Partnership in any way .

Further details are attached below and please do pass these details on to friends etc who might also be interested in attending.



## **Updates from the National Trust**

#### Beaver update - 'tails' of the unexpected!

Six months ago, we released wild beavers into Little Sea, Studland. A lot has happened since then, including three kits being born, a female beaver taking a short break in Swanage, and sadly, the death of one of the male beavers. Their activities have been monitored by our wonderful team of volunteers, who have spent countless hours wading through trail cam footage (or actual swamps!) to record their whereabouts. Although it's upsetting to have lost

**National** one of the beavers, it does highlight that they are wild animals that aren't in enclosures, and there are always risks with reintroductions. The loss doesn't affect the long-term aims of the project to introduce more animals and establish a healthy, viable population of beavers in

#### Vision for Middle Beach

This illustration is an artist's impression of how Middle Beach, Studland, might look when all man-made structures have gone and nature reshapes the cove. Work to remove the failing sea defences is underway and will continue until the end of October. It will involve some heavy machinery on the beach, so we apologise for any disruption. But the end goal is a beautiful, natural cove and wildlife haven. The beach where the work is taking place will remain closed until the cliffs have stabilised, but the car park, toilets, Sandy Salt Pig café and Fore Adventure will remain open.

#### **Devastating woodland disease**

Ash dieback is a devastating disease which is killing trees across the country. In Purbeck, Langton Westwood has hundreds of infected trees. Although standing deadwood is a great habitat for insects, birds and bats, we have to consider public safety, as the disease causes trees to drop limbs or topple completely. Following consultation with local stakeholders, we've agreed to fell some trees at Westwood and also close selected paths. Our aim is that people can still walk in

the woods, but in areas that can be made as safe as possible. Tree safety work will be taking place throughout October and November, and signs are being erected that show which paths are closed. It's not all doom and gloom - although some trees will be lost, light will be allowed into the woodland floor which will attract wildflowers, butterflies, pollinators and birds. And scientists have recently discovered that a new generation of ash trees is showing more resistance to the disease, giving renewed hope for the future of ash trees in the UK.

#### Saving our silent hunters

Many of you will have enjoyed the sight of ghostly barn owls flying over the fields and hedgerows at twilight. But did you know that these beautiful birds are often found dead in cattle troughs? Like most birds, barn owls need to bathe, but their feathers are adapted for slow, silent flight so they aren't very waterproof. If they fall into a trough, their feathers absorb the water causing them to sink. To prevent this, we are trialling a system at Weston Farm, Worth Matravers - putting 'rafts' on cattle troughs. These are made of treated timber and strong plastic mesh, with polystyrene for permanent buoyancy. They allow cattle to drink but prevent owls from sinking. (Find out more on the Barn Owl Trust website.) We'd like to pass on a huge thanks to our dedicated carpentry volunteers who made and installed the rafts.

#### Purbeck trailblazes environmental awards

A group of youngsters in Purbeck have become the first in the country to gain their Environmental Leaders award, thanks to our Senior Community and Volunteering Officer, Jill Bailey. She delivered, coordinated and assessed the course, which involved 12 students from The Purbeck School (11 to 14 years). Jill worked with them to build leadership skills like teamwork, communication, confidence, organisation and problem-solving. Then they went out with our tenant farmer, Jake Hancock, to explore the heaths and learn about conservation farming. On World Ocean Day, they joined various organisations at Studland Bay to promote awareness of seagrass

meadows, coastal erosion and plastic pollution on beaches. Our vision is to roll out the Environmental Leaders Programme across Purbeck and create sustainable career pathways for young people wanting to work in this field.

#### Slowing the flow

Work is about to begin on a project to reduce the risk of flooding along the Swan Brook - the stream that meets the sea in Swanage. This involves using natural measures to slow the flow of waterways. The six sites are on tenanted National Trust farmland, all located at the headwaters of tributaries that feed into the brook (Langton Matravers, Harman's Cross and Godlingston Manor Farm, Swanage). 

## **Swanage Neighbourhood Plan: Have Your Say!**

Dorset Coast Forum and Swanage Town Council are inviting residents to share their views on the proposals for the Swanage Neighbourhood Plan. The Swanage Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, a mix of councillors and community representatives, is now ready to hear from the community and develop a shared plan for the town.



A Neighbourhood Plan sets out a community's vision and priorities for land use and development in their neighbourhood, alongside policies with statutory weight in planning decisions. These policies help protect character areas, green spaces and community facilities, while guiding where and how development takes place. Having an adopted Neighbourhood Plan also means the community benefits from a greater share of the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) from chargeable developments - increasing from 15% (for communities without a Plan) to 25% once one is in place.

Once approved in a local referendum, and adopted, it becomes part of the statutory Development Plan for the Dorset Council area, meaning it must be considered when deciding planning applications, development proposals having to demonstrate how they meet the requirements set out in the policies of the Plan. Led by the local community, the Plan provides an opportunity for everyone to help shape future development and influence the well-being, sustainability, and long-term preservation of Swanage.

The policy themes currently under review for inclusion in the draft Swanage Neighbourhood Plan include:

- 1. Swanage Settlement
- 2. Housing Mix
- 3. Development Sites
- 4. Town Centre
- 5. Townscape Character
- 6. Open Space & Recreation, and Local Green Spaces
- 7. Community Facilities

Swanage Town Councillor Tina Foster, Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group, explains why this is a vital moment for Swanage:

"Since becoming a Town Councillor I have been keen for Swanage to have a stronger voice in planning matters and so welcome this chance to help shape the future of our town. There are benefits to having a Neighbourhood Plan as we will have more control over planning in Swanage and an extra 10% share of the Community Infrastructure Levy."

Dorset Coast Forum Coordinator Toni Powell emphasises the importance of community involvement:

"Neighbourhood planning gives the community a stronger voice and a shared vision for how Swanage should evolve. We strongly encourage everyone to get involved and have their say by completing the survey and joining us at one of the engagement events. Your ideas and feedback are vital and will help shape the draft Neighbourhood Plan."







The Purbeck Integrated Neighbourhood Team brings together all the providers of health and care services in Purbeck - including primary care, community care, adult social care, children and young people services and the voluntary sector - so they can work together more closely to help people stay well for longer and provide streamlined, personalised support when people need it. The PPGs in Purbeck are also working with the Purbeck Integrated Neighbourhood Team to ensure people living in Purbeck are involved in improving and shaping local services.

## Results for the Patient Survey carried out at the Surgery in June 2025

The results of the Patient Survey carried out by the PPG on behalf of the Practice have now been published in the News section on the Practice's website, together with the Practice's response to the PPG's recommendations for further action - please see: <a href="https://www.swanagemedical.org.uk/News">https://www.swanagemedical.org.uk/News</a>.

Our thanks to the 400 people who took part in our Survey. 86% described their overall experience of the Practice as good and 89% described their experience of making their appointment as good. 77% found it easy to contact the Practice by phone, 78% found it easy to contact the Practice via the website and 79% found it easy to contact the Practice using the NHS App. The results of the Survey are set out in full in the Report, together with all the comments provided by those who took part.

Although many patients rated their experience of using the Practice positively, getting an appointment at the Practice was clearly an issue for many of those who participated in our Survey. The PPG has therefore made recommendations to address these concerns - the PPG will be supporting the Practice to take forward these recommendations, which are also set out in the Report.

#### **PPG Meetings**

The PPG last met on 9 September 2025, when we were joined by Dr McIntosh, one of the GP Partners at the Practice. Our next PPG meeting will be held at the Surgery on **Tuesday 11 November 2025 at 12:30pm**.

The PPG works with the Practice Manager and the GPs at Swanage Medical Practice to help improve and shape local services. The PPG is made up of patients registered with the Practice who have volunteered to get involved. We meet every two months - and we are always looking for new members!

If you need one-off or occasional help, please self-refer yourself by phoning us on **07759 230313.** If you need more frequent help we would ask, after your first or second phone call to us, to get a formal Referral (ie. a phone call to the same number from an agency that is aware of your circumstances such as your child's school, your Social Worker, Mental Health worker, a church minister, the Focus Centre, your GP or Citizens Advice for example). We can then work together to help you.

It's sometimes quite tricky getting through to Citizen's Advice on the phone, so we highly recommend, if you can, finding them either at:

- > Herston Village Hall Community Cafe, Jubilee Rd, Swanage BH19 2SF on Mondays 10am-12pm
- > Swanage Library, High St, Swanage BH19 2NU on Tuesday 10am-12pm (except 1st in month)
- > Swanage Market, main long-stay car park, Victoria Ave on Fridays 9.30am 12.30pm.

#### Please try to phone us or a Referral Agency a day or two before you completely run out of food.

Thanks to all in the community who support the Food Bank in so many ways, including donations of (in-date & unused) food, toiletries and bags for life, financial donations and in prayer. We appreciate them all so much. You keep us going!

The later use of these buildings is also explored, coupled with the author's personal experience of working or living at these institutions over time.

#### Who we are

We are a local social group supporting the work of the National Trust, by organising talks, outings, social events and holidays. You don't have to be a member of the National Trust to join us.



#### What we're doing

Traditionally we've always taken a break from holding events in July and August, mainly because we know that many of our members are taking holidays or, living where we do, having friends or family to stay.

We got back into action in September with a lunch at Sculptures by the Lakes in Pallington and our first talk of the new season, when local author **Hay Cooper** (*Purbeck Revealed*) took us far beyond his beloved Isle of Purbeck to another area on which he is also an expert - Shekhawati, a region of Rajasthan and the amazing murals on many of the buildings.

We follow up in October with a talk in All Saints Church in Ulwell, when **Luke Mouland** will tell us about life in the Dorset workhouses in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, with some surprising stories of the designers, builders and organisers of the institutions, and of the people who were housed in them.

In November we return to Carey Hall in Wareham on Thursday 20th when **Peter Sills** will tell us about The Purbeck Mining Museum, one of Dorset's 'best kept secrets'.

Everybody is welcome at our talks. They start at 2.30pm and entry is £4, which includes tea/coffee and biscuits.

In October we'll also be having a coach outing to the wonderful *Milestones Living Museum* near Basingstoke. Set over 3 floors this tells the story of how people used to live, the things they used and the work they did. The maze of Victorian and 1930s streets is packed with original vehicles, shops, factories and houses, most based on original buildings from in and around Basingstoke. There is also a collection of restored vintage vehicles and steam engines including fine examples from top Hampshire manufacturers.



In November we're having a Skittles session, and in December an overnight trip to visit the National Trust's Waddesdon Manor in Buckinghamshire, to see the house decorated for Christmas.



Our hard-working Hereford cattle will be continuing their vital work in Durlston's meadows this Autumn, grazing back the dominant grasses to create space and opportunity for rare wildflowers – please continue to keep your dogs under close control, and ensure you close gates behind you to avoid any escapees!

If you'd like to learn more about Durlston's natural and geological wonders, why not join expert naturalist (and SPDT CEO!) Ali Tuckey on his 'Layers in the Landscape' guided walk on Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> October, to discover how geology, history, people and nature combined to create this unique landscape.

Our regular calendar of ranger-led guided walks continues, including explorations of the history and renovation of our Grade II Listed castle, and our popular '**Park to Pier**' event, taking in Durlston's Pleasure Grounds, the South West Coast Path and Swanage's lovingly restored pier – check our website for dates and further details.

For an insight into how our seas have shaped lives, between Tuesday 7th and Thursday 16th October the free 'Coastal Life Stories' photography exhibition by the Dorset Coast Forum will celebrate the work of nominated Coastal Champions - exceptional individuals and organisations dedicating their time, expertise, and passion to protecting, enhancing, and shaping the Dorset coast and its communities.

From Monday 20<sup>th</sup> October to Saturday 1st November, Durlston will play host to the **Purbeck Film Festival Exhibition**, featuring images and articles from this year's selected screenings, and offering a unique glimpse behind the programme. A variety of films will also screen in the Fine Foundation Gallery throughout the Festival, from investigative documentary 'The Grab' to coming-of-a drama 'Last Swim', and Drama/ Horror/Thriller 'Die Before You Die' (15), including a Q&A with Director Dan Pringle and cast member Laurent Lucas.


